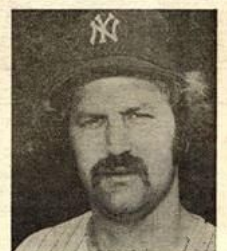

AIR CRASH KILLS YANKS' MUNSON

The charred skeleton of a twin-engine Cessna Citation jet owned by Yankee catcher Thurman Munson (inset) lies in a field near the Akron-Canton (Ohio) Regional Airport yesterday after it crashed during a practice landing approach. Munson, 31, died in the wreck. Two other passengers, David Hall, 32, the co-pilot, and Jerry D. Anderson, 31, a friend, survived and were being treated at area hospitals. Munson, who lived in the Canton area, leaves a wife and three children.
